The Mobile Lab Comes to Life!

The iSisters Mobile Lab will officially begin on August 10th, 2011 at Operation Come Home and Tewegan Transition House. During this first pilot session students will learn how to build their own website and gain some basic IT skills.

The Mobile Lab is a new project designed to take iSisters' award-winning technology training workshops to young women who are homeless or at risk of being homeless.

It is a misconception that all young people by virtue of their age are technologically literate. Digital literacy, technology skill development, internet access and its use are strongly influenced by

economic factors and those living on the margins, even in a technology rich society, are being left behind.

Over the next year, the iSisters Mobile Lab project will offer over 60 young women 21st Century technology skills that will help them to move forward with their lives and lead them toward further training, education and employment.

We would like to acknowledge our funding partners for this project: TELUS, The Community Foundation of Ottawa, The City of Ottawa, Alcatel-Lucent and Accenture's Skills to Succeed Program. Our community partners include Operation Come Home, Tewegan Transition House and The Youth Services Bureau of Ottawa.

On International Women's Day, iSisters launched its new Technology and Learning Centre in partnership with the Ottawa Community Immigrant Services Organization (OCISO).

2011 is the Centenary of International Women's Day and the theme that the United Nations selected was, *Equal access to education, training, science and technology. A pathway to decent*

work for women. It is a theme that could well have been chosen with iSisters in mind!

Over forty community members, staff, volunteers, sponsors and stakeholders joined us to celebrate the opening of our new lab.

Computers 4 Communities (C4C) is a local non-profit organization that aims to provide families in need access to refurbished computer in exchange for community service.

C4C was introduced to Immigrant Women Services of Ottawa (IWSO) by iSisters. After hearing about the great work that iSisters and IWSO have been doing to train women in technology, C4C agreed to donate 10 computers to the graduates of the IWSO/iSisters program.

C4C was honoured to be invited to the graduation ceremony at IWSO. During the ceremony, certificates were handed out, snacks were shared and there were even some songs. At the conclusion of the ceremony, C4C drew names and the winners were announced. Ten families were in receipt of refurbished computers and one year of technical support!
